

## LAURA ACKERMAN

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Growing up as a teenage cartoonist in Eastern Washington, I began my interest in graphic arts by studying comic books; looking at layout, color and the combinations of type styles and hand lettering. My early experiments with pen and ink (styled loosely on a combination of Aubry Beardsley and Robert Crumb), made me aware of the need not only for control of the media, but also for the desire to communicate to my readers the content of my ideas.

I have been a visual artist since the mid-70'sp; specializing in illustration with a sense of narrative-working either with images from nature, or fantasy sequences that I have dreamed of. After seeing my first Pixar animated short at Bumbershoot in 1997, I saw the need to go back to school and get training in multimedia design, realizing that to continue on as an artist in the 21st century, I would need to understand digital applications like Photoshop, Illustrator, Flash and Maya, among others.

During this time period, I began to teach illustration techniques through a community college. I fell in love with the process of teaching; the interactions between me and the students and the knowledge that was gained by both of us was very rewarding. Both me and my students felt empowered. My second teaching job at the International Academy of Design and Technology, confirmed this impression. I taught Graphic Design I and Advanced Digital Imaging to classes of beginning "at-risk" students, and having come from a background like this myself, I felt that I was able to teach complex technological design solutions to people who had, more often than not, never used a computer seriously before.

After graduation from Shoreline Community College, I worked with a variety of business and educational clients to develop web or graphic design- often creating whole business identity systems, as well as writing content for their web sites. I learned how to listen to my clients, and to work and re-work comps until we both arrived at a design that really got noticed. I have tried hard to learn not only software applications, but to also deliver art that fits each client's need and culture.

My Master's degree received from Antioch University allowed me to continue studying the complexity of user versus computer interfaces: navigation, icons and symbols, methodolgies of "best practices" in delivering understandable tutorials. I hope to be allowed to continue my research at the doctoral level in semiotics and graphical user interfaces, and continue to teach, and work on several paintings a year.
